Every day, advances in technology unearth another secret of the universe. Every day, there are new discoveries, new information, amazing facts beyond our imagination, the impossible becomes possible and the unbelievable becomes believable.

How is it, then, with all the wonders of creation at our fingertips, people still have doubts about the *Creator*, rejecting the resurrection of Jesus as an impossibility? How is it that we see with our own eyes' life rising from the dust of the earth, yet we cannot wrap our minds around life rising *again* from the tomb?

All the marvels of technology confirm for me that I cannot trust my own senses - that there are things at work here that I simply cannot see, hear, taste, touch, or smell. There are things beyond my comprehension. One day, I know that all will be revealed. But, in the meantime, *I choose* to believe the unbelievable! To embrace the impossible!

Come! Explore impossibilities with us this Easter! Come, and be amazed at what God has done, for you!
