The Gift-Giver...

I stood ankle deep in the Gulf and wiggled my toes in the sand with a satisfied sigh. The water was cold, but the sun was hot, and I had hours to leisurely walk the beach. I turned my eyes heavenward and was about to pray the prayer I have always prayed at the



beginning of some precious beach time: "Lord, what would you give me today?" I'd pray that prayer, then begin to comb the beach for that *one* treasure, that *gift* from God that would catch my eye; a shell, a sand dollar, a bit of driftwood that stood out above the rest. When I found it, I'd scoop it up with a prayer of thanks, not just for the gift, but for the reassurance that God had heard my prayer and was with me. But, to my surprise, this time, the words did not come. I opened my mouth and then shut it again, realizing with a smile that for the first time at the beach, there was no "thing" I needed or wanted from God. No gift, no boon, no trinket. The sun and the sea and the sound of the waves crashing to shore was proof enough of God's presence, and I was content.

A little shiver of joy ran through me as I began to walk. I felt God walking the shoreline with me more deeply than I'd ever felt it before. And, not searching for that one God-offering to take home with me freed me up to pay more attention to the natural beauty around me. I watched as the sandpipers moved in one, fluid movement away from the water and back; away and back again, like a little wave themselves. Their tiny three-toed feet left hundreds of little imprints of the Trinity – the three-in-one – all over the sand. Everywhere I looked, it was as if God was telling me "I am here!" I marveled at the message that lay all around me, creating a memory better than any souvenir I could have carried off to gather dust on my bookshelf!

What a glad reminder, especially at Christmas, that this life is not about the *gifts*, but about the *Gift-Giver!* It's about a love relationship, above all, with *Emmanuel* - God with us. And that is better than any earthly gift we could possibly receive.

May you feel God's presence with you this Christmas as never before!
