Certainty in Uncertain Times...

I was reading an article in one of my spiritual journals when I came across this quote from Freidrich Von Hugel. "What a happiness, what a joy it is to be quite sure there is a God." he said. I thought about that. And I recognized that for me, this is a very true statement. Deep within my heart, I know there *is* a God, and this knowledge *does* bring me happiness and joy.



Looking back, it seems as though I have *always* known there was God. I can't remember a time when I ever doubted God's existence. I *have* doubted that God *cared* for me. I *have* questioned the way God *did* things and have given God *all kinds* of great advice on how I would have handled a situation differently. I *have* totally misunderstood who God *is*, but I have *never* doubted that God *was*.

This certainty of mine that there is a God was something I used to take for granted. But over the years, I have discovered that there are people who *want* to believe in God, who *yearn* for the certainty that I have, but have been unable to get there. I have felt their spiritual pain and have come to appreciate my certainty for what it is – a gift from God. I especially appreciate this gift in uncertain times like the one we are living in right now. Everywhere I go, people seem to be more anxious about the future than before the pandemic struck. Things have changed so much so fast that people say they feel like they can't depend on anything anymore! This really isn't new for us humans. Remember that old saying, "Nothing is certain except death and taxes."? Well, to that I say the *only* sure thing in this world is that God is!

God Is in control, even if it doesn't seem like it at times.

God Is invested in us, loves and cares for all people.

God Is acting in our lives to bring about what is best for each of us.

God Is powerful, willing and able to accomplish God's purposes for the world.

God Is with us and will never leave us or forsake us.

God Is Good, and Good wins out over Evil, every time!

This is the hope that we who believe live in. This is the hope that keeps us putting one foot before the other, no matter what is going on in the world around us. It is what moves us to stay calm and content in a culture that feeds on fear. Von Hugel was right. What a happiness, what a joy it is to be quite certain that *God is!*

So, how do we get to that certainty, if it is something we have not yet been able to grasp? Pray for it! Ask God to give you his gift of faith. Spend time in silence, listening for God to speak to your heart. Take a walk outside and look for God in all things. Read the Bible. Attend a worship service. And, as always, if you are in need of a little spiritual guidance, give me a call. We'll talk. And, in time, you will begin to know in your heart that *God Is*. I am as certain of that as I am of God's existence! Because God loves you and is waiting for you to open your heart and let him in.

Cinquain Poems from our Confirmation Youth

Besides the regular Small Catechism studies which includes learning what the Creeds and the Ten Commandments might mean for them as they mature in their faith, it is important for our Youth to think and pray about their own spirituality. One way we have done that is for each of the students to compose their own poem called a cinquain. The cinquain follows this pattern:

- 1 word as your Subject
- 2 words describing the subject
- 3 words describing the subject's activity
- 4 words describing your feelings about it
- 1 word with the same meaning as the subject.

The assignment was to read the Apostles Creed, pick a word that spoke to them and create the poem from that word as his or her Subject. This exercise helps us think about what we believe, deepening our understanding of the Apostles Creed as a way of expressing our faith. Here are three of our student's poems:
