An Epiphany! The Night is as Bright as the Day...

Our daughter, Sara, has always been afraid of the dark. As a child when the rest of us needed darkness to fall asleep, Sara had to have the light on. We'd tiptoe in and turn it off after she was dreaming, but sometime during the night, she would wake up and turn the light back on and it would still be shining at the break of dawn. But, in



fairness to Sara, I have not been particularly fond of the dark myself, at times. I love nights when the moon is full and the stars fill the sky, too numerous to count. But, on the nights when the moon is hidden in cloud, and you can't see your hand in front of your face, all sorts of terrifying things fill my imaginings. Every breeze brings maniacal laughter. Every twig snapping makes me jump, and I am quick to reach for a flashlight.

The media reinforces my fear of the dark, because nearly everything bad that happens on TV or in movies happens in the dark! Even how the Church talks about God confirms that the dark is not safe, urging us to turn from darkness and come into the Light that is Christ. But, in her book, *Learning to Walk in the Dark*, priest and author Barbara Brown Taylor has given me a new way of thinking about the dark. In her intro, she says Christian theology "is built on dividing reality into opposed pairs: good/evil, church/world, spirit/flesh, sacred/profane, light/dark. In every case, the language of opposition works by placing half of reality closer to God and the other half farther away." I get that. I was raised with that language and preach it myself! But "Even when light fades and darkness falls," Taylor continues, "God does not turn the world over to some other deity..." How good to hear that the Bright Morning Star, the Light of the World, does not hand the reins over to Evil when the sun goes down.

This has been an *epiphany* for me. An "Aha!" moment. For God has revealed God's self to me in a new way. Now I need not fear the dark, for I have heard that the God of Light is also God of the Dark and is with me 24/7. This is not new information, but I was able to internalize this Word from God at a deeper level, and I feel closer to him than ever before, which is often the way with epiphanies. They give you new ears.

May the God of both the day and the night bless you with many epiphanies in the New Year! Happy 2021! Pastor Barb <><

Notes from 2021 Annual Congregational Meeting

Mt. Zion - St. Luke held its annual congregational meeting on December 13, 2020 and after a quorum was observed the following actions were taken:

- 1) The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Barb Koch.
- 2) Minutes of the 2019 annual meeting were read by Katie Felker and accepted as presented.

<u>Foundation Fund and Hegler Fund:</u> Tommy Martin reported we received \$4,700 in memorials this year, bringing the balance of the Foundation Fund to \$290,035. The Hegler Fund balance is currently \$106,844. This is substantially less than last year's balance due to withdrawals to cover the cost of the repairs currently being made to our church buildings.

Adoption of the 2021 Budget: Max Wood and Joe McNutt presented the budget for 2021, which was very similar to that of 2020. Spending in 2020 was down due to the cancellation of some events and activities. The \$1,000 budgeted for Synod Assembly was instead donated to the Synod to help alleviate shortfalls the synod has experienced this year. The congregation raised an additional \$1,400 to add to that donation. Tommy Martin motioned that we accept the 2021 budget as presented with Joe McNutt giving the second. The motion passed unanimously.

<u>Election of New Council Members:</u> Jon Coogle, Katie Felker and Arthur Jackson will complete their Council terms at the end of the year. The Council approved David Haigler, Julia Snipes, and Diane Cagle as nominees for 2021 Council. With no other nominations, it was motioned and seconded to accept the nominees. The motion passed unanimously. The new Congregational Council will be installed in January 2021 during worship **Other Business:** No other business was mentioned.


<u>Motion to Adjourn:</u> Tommy Martin motioned to adjourn the meeting with Bobby Martin giving the second.
