Heartbreak and Hope...

The sun was gold. The sky was blue. The masks we wore were as varied in color as our skin as we gathered around the steps of City Hall in Montezuma for prayer before beginning our *Day of Unity* march to Charlie Jackson Park downtown. It did my heart good to see about 200 people; African Americans, whites, clergy, police officers and governmental



officials all walking peacefully but purposefully together to take a stand for real change in our national systems so that all people might have the same rights and access to resources that we are all *supposed* to have under the law.

For most of my life, I have heard the saying, "We are all created equal, but some of us are more equal than others." Over the past few months, I have watched the heartbreaking results of that kind of thinking in the form of social unrest across our nation. I think the pain of routinely being treated as less than equal is like a pressure cooker. Sometimes you have to let the steam out or you will explode. And, the rest of us, who have it pretty good most of the time, often cannot see the hurt that has led up to protests. Some of us only see the angry outbursts and shake our heads at such behavior.

But, along with the heartbreak, I am also filled with hope. Because it takes true empathy to be able to look beyond the acting out behavior to the reasons behind it. It takes a loving heart to want to do something to correct the problems and take the pressure off, so there is no need for release. That empathy and love were very evident on that Day of Unity march.

I was part of a group of diverse people all coming together with the same goal – to ask our country to uphold the basic tenets on which it was founded so there truly *is* liberty and justice *for all*. I am hopeful because I see evidence of a growing number of people of all colors that are willing to listen to each other and do the hard work so that real, systemic change happens. As you celebrate Independence Day this year, may you thank God for the freedoms you enjoy, and may you pray and be willing to do the work it takes so that *all* your neighbors can do the same. *Peace, Pastor Barb* <><

Phase 1 Guidelines for In-Person Worship to Continue through July 2020

We continue to look to our synod leadership for guidance as to our in-person worship which began 6-7-2020. While we in Oglethorpe have been spared the devastating number of cases of Covid 19 that other, more populated areas of the nation have experienced, the number of cases in Macon county and the state of Georgia as a whole have continued on a slow rise.

Our synod recommends that congregations who have returned to in-person worship continue to follow the Phase I guidelines until the numbers start to go down. We have no reported illnesses in our congregation since we resumed in person worship, and we plan to keep it that way! Your Congregation Council continues to reassess the situation weekly. When the numbers go down, our next step is to make masks voluntary.

So, until we see an improvement in the numbers, we will continue to follow the guidelines below as we gather in our sanctuary for worship. We continue to offer our service online for those who are unable to join us in person at this time, and we are encouraged by the positive response and comments from those who join us to worship as a virtual community.

- 1. Face coverings and social distancing of at least 6 feet in family groups will be required.
- 2. Hand Sanitizer is at both entrances for your use upon entering the building.
- 3. Offerings will be placed in the plate at both entrances.
- 4. Communion will be self-contained individual cups picked up at the entrances.
- 5. No physical passing of the peace.
- 6. Face coverings and social distancing of at least 6 feet to be kept *after* the service as well.


