That was about useless, and I always ended up craning my neck to look over my shoulder to make sure I didn't hit anything. Because, even with an assistive device, you just can't see as well when you are looking out the back window.

I always feel a bit relieved when I turn around and look out that big front windshield, put the car in drive and head on down the road. The rearview mirror is then only a tool to be aware of my surroundings. A brief glance backward now and then is sufficient. For, there is always more of a risk of an accident when you are looking behind you than when you are looking ahead.

That's a good analogy for us as a church, as well. We've been idling for a while now, sitting out this pandemic. Out of necessity, our view has been narrow – confined to that little rearview mirror and the things that lay behind us. Seen from that vantage point, the future of the church looks bleak indeed. We look at how it used to be and wonder if we will ever get there again.

It's time to decide where we are going and how we are going to get there, using that rearview mirror only as a tool to be aware of our surroundings.

#### SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2021

On Saturday, June 5, Mary and I attended the 2021 Synod Assembly sitting in our home office in front of our computers. It was Bishop Kevin Stricklands's first time at presiding over the assembly and it was the first ever "digital" assembly. The theme of the assembly was "Equip, Empower and Engage the Beloved Community." A total of 280 voting members were in attendance. The assembly was live-streamed from Redeemer Lutheran Church in Atlanta.

Several elections were held during the assembly, including the election of Pastor Randy Jones as Synod Secretary for a second term. Voting members were elected to serve at the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly to be held in Columbus, Ohio, as well as two at-large members of the Synod Council. Conference representatives, who were elected in a pre-assembly gathering in March, were ratified by the Synod Assembly. That number included me, as I was elected to serve a second two-year term.

The 2022-2023 Ministry Funding Plan was adopted and the 2022 Compensation Guidelines for pastors and other congregational staff were approved. Additionally, several changes to the Synod constitution were approved, including the establishment of a new Mission Endowment Fund.

If it seems that the assembly was all routine business and, well, rather dull, I should point out that the assembly began with some lively music and a very inspirational worship service. It ended with a moving presentation of the 2021 Robert S. and Jean E. Graetz Advocacy Award to Mr. Jerry Weyrauch for his lifetime of work in suicide prevention, including the founding of the Suicide Prevention Advocacy Network. During the breaks, video presentations by the Synod's ministry partners were played (and these are available to congregations).

While it was convenient to "attend" the assembly from home, Mary and I missed some of the perks of an in-person assembly: Visiting with some of our former pastors, participating in the very creative worship services, and enjoying the amenities of downtown Chattanooga. I am pleased to let you know that the 2022 Synod Assembly will be held on June 3, 4, and 5 in Chattanooga.
