

We'd been to the site of the old Flint River Ferry – the East ramp side - where a fat, brown dog with a soft mouth and soft eyes sat on my foot and begged for a head rub. #### REOPENING FOR IN PERSON WORSHIP SUNDAY JUNE 7, 2020

Church Council has voted to reopen for in person worship on Sunday June 7, 2020 at 11:00 a.m. As required by the guidelines, masks and social distancing will be mandatory during the service. The service will be live streamed through Facebook and will be available at the 11:00 hour or later. We will continue to monitor the conditions and as soon as possible return to somewhat regular worship. Sunday school and Coffee Hour will resume at a later time. #### Phase 1 Guidelines for Reopening Churches.

We are following synod guidelines for a Phased approach to reopening for in-person worship at MZSL to hopefully ensure the safety of our most vulnerable members. For the first two weeks, June 7<sup>th</sup> and June 14<sup>th</sup>:

- 1. Face coverings and social distancing of at least 6 feet in family groups will be required.
- 2. Hand Sanitizer at entrances for your use upon entering the building.
- 3. Offerings will be placed in the plate at the entrances.
- 4. Communion will be self-contained individual cups (if they arrive in time,) or bread only.
- 5. No physical passing of the peace.
- 6. Social distancing of at least 6 feet to be kept *after* the service as well.

As Jon said in his article above, we will continue to assess the situation and modify our requirements as we are safely able. We will continue to offer the service online for those who do not feel safe to return to in-person worship or cannot join us for other reasons.
