The weeds had taken over my flower bed. Before I could plant the seeds for this year's array, I had to get rid of those soil-sucking weeds, or the baby plants would not thrive. So, I began to pull them up mercilessly by the root. I wasn't paying much attention, just wanting to get the job done, when I realized that one plant, I had pulled up wasn't a weed! I held in my hand a tiny live oak seedling; it's long tap root threading out from an acorn. I had never tried to grow a tree from seed before, but I couldn't bear the thought of cutting this little one's brief life short by throwing it on the weed pile. So, I carefully replanted it, saying a prayer that it would take hold and grow. Since then, I've watered, fed and cared for

There are times in our lives when we will be much like this live oak seedling. We'll be going merrily about our days, enjoying the sun and rain, when all of a sudden, Life will come along and pull us by the roots! Being uprooted can take many forms: a death in the family, a chronic illness, job loss, divorce. And it isn't only bad things that can uproot us and change our whole lives. Good change, like a promotion, graduation, marriage, or the birth of a child is disruptive, too.

Life events like these can leave us hanging out there, roots in the wind, wondering where we will land next. It would be easy to panic, in those times. But, we who love the Lord have the assurance that we are not at the mercy of fate. We are being held in God's hands, and God, who *loves* us, cannot bear to see *us* tossed on the weed heap, *either*! Every time we get torn up, God will tenderly replant us. He will carefully choose a place for us where we can take hold and grow.

Will it be easy? Not always. Often, we will end up in unfamiliar territory. But, God will not leave us there to fend for ourselves. He will water, feed and care for us, wherever he plants us. And, we will find ourselves not just *surviving*, but *thriving* - healthier and happier in the *new* place than we were before, if we but trust in the wisdom of The Master Gardener.
