"Can we talk?" she asked. "Of course!" I said. "I'll meet you in the carport in an hour." How good it was to meet and talk with my friend and share our thoughts. I guess that is one good thing to have come out of this

pandemic. After being apart for so long, and depending on technology to try to stay connected, I have a new appreciation for how important the love and support of a friend is to my sense of well-being.

When it comes to defining friendship, this poem by George Eliot has long been a favorite of mine. It reads:

Oh, the comfort, the inexpressible comfort of feeling safe with a person; having neither to weigh thoughts nor measure words, but to pour them all out, just as they are, chaff and grain together, knowing that a faithful hand will take and sift them, keep what is worth keeping, and then, with a breath of kindness, blow the rest away.

This is the kind of friend God has been for us human beings since the Creation, when God got up from his knees, dusted off his hands and said, "Can we talk?" And in the cool of the evening, God walked and talked with his people. We were friends. We were *safe* with each other. After we messed it up, God, like a true friend, never gave up on us. He longed to make things right between us. So, he came down in the form of Jesus to be one of us. Through him, God opened the door so that we could talk together as friends again.

How good it to know that, with God, we need neither weigh our thoughts nor measure our words, but can confidently pour them all out, knowing that God, who knows our hearts, will sort it all out and keep only what is worthy of us. That is the gift that Jesus has given us. He has made us friends with God. And, as his Church, we are connected to one another in the same way. Better still, it is a gift that will never end. We are Best Friends Forever! We will never be alone. Amen to that!

Liking Jesus – A New Wednesday Evening Bible Study

On Wednesday, May 5, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., the Wednesday Evening Bible Study Group led by Pastor Barb, will begin a new video series called *Liking Jesus*. The series looks at the benefits of technology that we all love but addresses that sometimes negative consequences of that technology that can affect us unknowingly. We all can relate to the fact that the more we interact online the more we crave face-to-face intimacy; the more we compare ourselves to others, the less satisfied we are, and the more filtered our lives become, the more challenging it is to be authentic. Over the five-week study, we will rediscover our understanding of the Biblical principles of life with Christ: *Recovering Contentment, Restoring Intimacy, Revealing Authenticity, Resurrecting Compassion, and Replenishing Rest.* The series also encourages deeper reflection on your own with a study guide for personal reflection outside of class.
